

LETTER FROM ST MARY'S



Dear Friends

I want to talk about ants! I'm sure you've all seen nature documentaries featuring a colony of ants carrying leaves and food back to their nest. It's an impressive display of teamwork where the colony work together to get resources where they need them. They are an example of what can be achieved with each playing their part to fulfil a greater goal.

A campaign has grown in the past few years, 'No Mow May', which encourages us to leave our gardens unmown for the month to allow wild flowers to grow, to help with the bee population and generally do our bit to reverse the ecological damage done to our precious world. It may not seem worth doing on our own but when each unmown small garden is added to others, a greater difference can be made. We can all see the affects of climate change are no longer confined solely to far away places. Recent Met Office statistics show we had a record amount of rainfall (1.69 m or 5 ft 6 inches) in the 18 months to March 2024. This is the highest level for any 18-month period in England since comparable data began in 1836. We need to do something and your small something combined with my small something and lots of other small somethings can really make a difference. And if you don't believe me – look at the ants!



NEWS FROM RINGMER PARISH COUNCIL



PARISH COUNCIL VACANCIES

We regularly invite residents to join the Parish Council. Meetings of the council are open to residents to attend and there is an opportunity at the start of the meeting for residents to speak. The next scheduled meetings are Thursday 2 May at 10am (Office & Finance) and Tuesday 7 May at 7pm (Full Council) and are held in the Parish Rooms, Greater Paddock, Ringmer.

We have been told that the swimming pool will not open before September. While this is disappointing, we have no control over the project.

FINGERPOST FIELD – SKATE PARK AND PLAY PARK

The construction of the new skate park is awaiting ESCC to authorise construction of the access from the B2192. Construction of the new playground will begin in June and is expected to take four weeks.

JUBILEE GARDENS

The Parish Council are working with Goldcliff Garden Centre to restock the two flower beds that have been rather neglected. Preparing the larger flower bed for planting has started. If any resident would like to help with the planting and routine maintenance of the Jubilee Gardens please contact the Clerk on 01273 813242.

THE ALMOND FIELD

The Almond Field will be open to residents from 1 May. Access is from the public footpath in the New Cemetery. At the request of the family, and as the area is a designated SDNPA Call for Nature Site, dogs are not allowed in the field. The ground is very uneven to please take care. Over time the council will be supporting work to increase the biodiversity of the field. If any resident would like to be involved with working in the Almond Field please contact the Clerk.

POLICE REPORT

Each month we receive a report from our PCSO. It is disturbing to read that incidents of illegal or unruly behaviour occur so frequently. If you are a victim of, or witness, such behaviour or have information that may help apprehend the culprits, please telephone 101.

LEWES DISTRICT COUNCILLOR UPDATE

Lewes District Concillor Emily O'Brien gives an update on various village matters.

GOOD NEWS ON DOG FOULING

Following concerns raised by residents and a similar query from Ringmer Parish Council, it was clarified that dog fouling is no longer a byelaw. The whole of Lewes District is, however, covered by a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) for dog fouling, which means we could serve a fixed penalty notice on someone for not picking up. The problem is, of course, catching the perpetrators.

I am pleased to confirm that Lewes District Council's Neighbourhood First Team have agreed to provide extra signage and patrols for Ringmer to help tackle the problem.

HGV ACTION

Following the petition and protest in Ringmer, I'm pleased to say that East Sussex County Council have confirmed they have started work on a freight strategy, to include a desktop policy review. Early work began in February and ESCC will carry out further engagement on the preliminary draft for stakeholders. Once started, the consultation will be publicised at consultation.eastsussex.gov.uk

WATER QUALITY

At an all-party parliamentary group meeting, I secured a commitment from Natural England to sharing the Lewes Brookes SSSI action plan (following the deterioration shown in the assessment completed last April). This includes actions for Southern Water and to more transparent sharing of action plans going forward.

I've also secured a commitment from OFWAT and Southeast Water to hold a consultation event with Lewes District Council in autumn around their proposal to extract water from the river Ouse to fill their proposed new Arlington Reservoir scheduled for 2050 - when the existing stress on the River Ouse is likely to be exacerbated by increased climate pressures.

Along with council officers and the Ouse and Adur Rivers Trust, in my Cabinet role I took Southern Water representatives on a tour of our partnership projects including the Scout Hut, Cheyney Field attenuation ponds, the Scout Hut and Kings Academy where there are rain gardens added to the downpipes. I was pleased that at the meeting Southern Water confirmed they intend to invest in similar natural flood management solutions in many of the areas which I've been highlighting, including around £2.8 million targeted at Ringmer. Obviously this is only part of the solution, and I'll continue to hold them to account on storm overflows, but gratifying none the less to see the problems being acknowledged.

This is the first in a series of old photographs of Ringmer, courtesy of Ringmer History Group.

This house, Elm Court, was built in 1909 on the Lewes Road site now occupied by The Maples. The builder was farmer, Shire horse breeder and hotelier Richard King-Sampson, who used his Ringmer farms to provide produce for his Crowborough Beacon

hotel. After housing Canadian soldiers during World War II, the house became a hotel, variously known as the Ringmer Inn, Crow's Nest and Classic Inn, before its demolition in 1998. The blocks of flats called St Martins and St Anthonys, Harrisons Lane, were built on its extensive gardens and tennis court.
